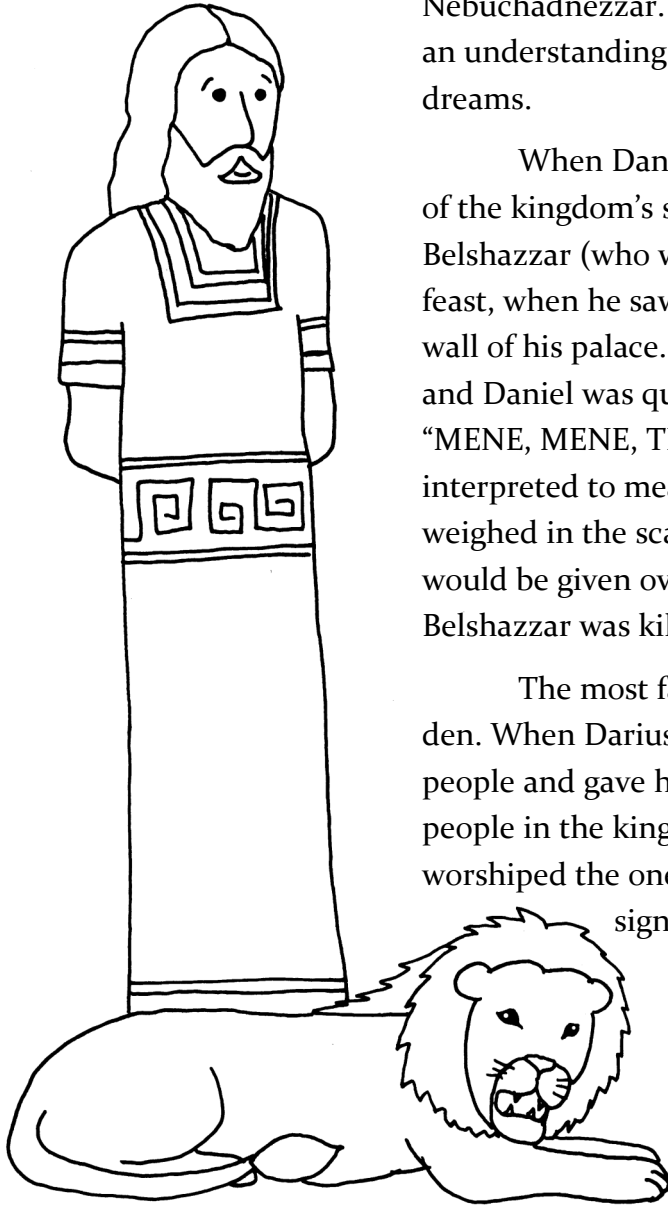


Daniel
