The highest point in the Smoky Mountains is Clingmans Dome at 6,643 feet high!




The Great Smoky National Park is the most visited National Park with over 9 million visitors each year!



Seven Mile bridge was one of the longest in the world when it was built in 1982. It's actually only 6.79 miles long!
