
Moses

Moses was born in Egypt when the Israelites were slaves to the Egyptians. The Pharaoh during this time was worried that the Israelites were increasing in number too quickly and might revolt, so he ordered the death of all the boy babies. To save Moses from death, his mother put him in a basket and floated him down the Nile River. Moses was rescued and adopted by the Egyptian princess, and was raised to be a prince.

Once he grew up, he got in trouble for helping an Israelite slave and fled to the wilderness of Midian to avoid punishment. While in the wilderness tending sheep, God spoke to Moses through a burning bush. God told Moses to go back to Egypt to free the Israelites and take them to a promised land. Moses resisted several times, but God continued to call and equip Moses.

Moses went to the Pharaoh to ask for the Israelites freedom, but was denied. God sent a series of plagues, or terrible disasters, to the Egyptians, including frogs, locusts, biting flies, sores, turning water to blood, the cattle all became sick, darkness, thunderstorm of hail and fire, and finally the death of all first born boys. The Israelites were warned about the last plague and were instructed to mark their homes with lambs' blood to avoid the death of their children, and this became the first Passover. Eventually, the Pharaoh let the Israelites go, but

then changed his mind and chased after them. Pharaoh's army was destroyed when they tried to follow the Israelites through the Red Sea, which God parted for the Israelites safe passage.

Moses also went up Mount Sinai, talked with God and delivered the Ten Commandments to the Israelites. They continually struggled with their faith and keeping order. Moses and the Israelites traveled for 40 years through the desert to get to the promised land.






