
Saint Teresa of Calcutta



Saint Teresa of Calcutta was named Agnes Bojaxhiu when she was born on August 20, 1910 in Macedonia, a small country in Europe. She took the name Teresa when she moved to Ireland to join the Loreto Convent in 1928. Her name Teresa is an English form of Saint Therese of Lisieux who she chose as her patroness.

In 1929, she was sent to Calcutta, India. Several years later, she made her final vows as a Loreto nun and since then she's been known as Mother Teresa. Upon taking her final vows, she said she became "the spouse of Jesus for all eternity. She taught at St. Mary's School for girls for many years. She was known for her charity, hard work, organization, unselfishness, and courage, and she was said to have served with great joy.

In 1946, Mother Teresa heard a call from Jesus to help the poorest of the poor, and eventually this led her to start the Missionaries of Charity. It took two years between the time she heard the call and was allowed to start a new order. She left her convent and headed to the worst parts of town to help the poorest and saddest people she could find. Every day she went out in search of helping those that no one else would help—the most unwanted and unloved people she could find. In 1950, the Missionaries of Charity was officially established, and it quickly grew in numbers.

Mother Teresa also began other organizations, like the Co-workers of Mother Teresa and the Sick and Suffering Co-workers, so that people of other faiths and those with different vocations could still help the cause to which she was called.

She became a canonized saint on September 4, 2016!




