Plymouth Rock is the site of the first permanent settlement of the Europeans in America. They sailed to North America aboard the Mayflower in 1620.

Lake Champlain is a freshwater lake on the border of the US and Canada. It borders both the states of New York and Vermont. It is at the northernmost part of the Appalachian Valley, which extends all the way into Alabama. Lake Champlain was named after Samuel de Champlain who found it in 1609.
